You might want to take the opportunity to explore the area whilst you're there. The **reservoirs** and **dams** in the area are steeped in history from flooded villages resting under the water to training grounds for the dam busters.



Perhaps you would like to minimise emissions and travel to the Peak District National Park

by public transport. **Edale** is situated at the base of **Kinder Scout** and is also close to the **Great Ridge**, two iconic areas in the Peak District National Park. The station provides great links to both Sheffield and Manchester and is 5 minutes' walk from our Moorland Centre.
