
Bemrose Trial at Washgate

Part of the route takes the entrants along Washgate near Hollinsclough where the Authority made a Traffic Regulation Order last year. We are working with the organisers to ensure that impacts are reduced and controlled and which will include site notices and marshals.



Conksbury Bridge




Silence at Silence Mine
