## CORE STRATEGY Adoption Statement October 2011

The Peak District National Park Authority formally adopted its Core Strategy Development Plan Document (DPD) on 7 October 2011. The Core Strategy DPD is the principal document of the Local Development Framework and sets out a vision, spatial strategy and core policies to guide development and change in the National Park up to 2026.

The Core Strategy DPD was subject to examination by an independent Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government. The examination included hearing sessions in April 2011. The Inspector's Report was received on 15 July 2011. The adopted Core Strategy incorporates the binding recommendations of the Inspector.
