# How to behave during your visit


- Socially distance yourselves from the Public as they will not be in your bubble. (That means at least 2 metres).

# Things for each student to bring

- Suitable clothing including a waterproof coat to match the weather forecast, including hat and gloves if it is going to be cold and sunblock if it's hot.
- Wellies, or old trainers to get wet.
- Hand sanitizer, to use especially before you eat or drink.
- Clipboard, method sheets and a polythene bag to cover them in case of rain.
- A pen and pencil.
- A mask to wear in public toilets or to your preference anytime.



# Social Distancing still 2 metres where possible



- There are some places on your route where social distancing may need some thought.
- The first sites are around 40 minutes walk away and you will cross narrow bridges with hand rails.
- Care must be taken when meeting members of the public and you will need to try and manage social distancing and stay 2 metres apart. Keeping your distance from other members of the public.
