Please confirm the manner in which MHC requires data arising to be reported.	We have an established network including staff in National Parks leading Landscape Recovery projects. This has been established by National Parks Partnership. There are no formal agreements around information sharing in place in this forum and the need for this has not been highlighted at this stage. It is more likely for your work to involve feeding into these relationships but attendance at the forums on a regular basis would be by the Authority's Project Manager. There may be occasions where the tenderer would be invited to attend the forum.
