

## **NOTICE OF THE CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER**

### **HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 SECTION 119 THE PEAK DISTRICT NATIONAL PARK AUTHORITY PUBLIC FOOTPATH NO. 31 (Part) - PARISH OF BONSCALL COUNTY OF DERBYSHIRE PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2022**

On the 17 January 2023 the Peak District National Park Authority confirmed the above Order made under s119 Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the Order is to divert the whole width of that part of Public Footpath No. 31 Bonsall shown by a bold continuous line on the Order Map commencing at Point A at grid reference SK 2656 5948 running in a generally north westerly, then generally westerly and finally generally north north easterly direction to Point B at grid reference SK 2647 5957 a length of approximately 145 metres or thereabouts.

To a 1.8 metre wide natural surfaced footpath in the parish of Bonsall, shown by a bold broken line on the Order Map commencing at Point A at grid reference SK 2656 5948, running in a north north westerly direction to Point C at grid reference SK 2654 5955, then north north easterly to Point D at grid reference SK 2654 5956, then north west to Point E at grid reference SK 2655 5956 and finally north west and west north west to Point F at grid reference SK 2648 5958 a length of approximately 150 metres or thereabouts.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the Order Map have been placed at and may be seen free of charge at Aldern House, Baslow Road Bakewell Derbyshire DE45 1AE between 9.00am and 5.00pm. Copies of the Order and Order Map may be bought there at the price of £5.00.

Any person who wishes to claim compensation under section 28 as applied by s121(2) of the Highways Act 1980 for depreciation or damage for disturbance arising as a result of the coming into force of the Order must make a claim in writing addressed to Head of Engagement at Aldern House, Baslow Road Bakewell Derbyshire DE45 1AE and serve it by delivering it at or sending it by prepaid post to that address not later than 9 March 2023. Copies of the sections are attached.

The Order will come into force 28 days from the date of this confirmation or on the day on which the Authority certifies that there has been created to the reasonable satisfaction of the Authority an alternative highway for use as a replacement for the said footpath as provided above (whichever is the later). But if a person aggrieved by the Order wants to question its validity or that of any provision contained in it on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980 as amended or on the ground that any requirement of the Act as amended or any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order he or she may under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act within 6 weeks from 26 January 2023 make an application to the High Court.
