NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 – SECTION 119

Public Footpath No 12 (Part) Parish of Parwich County of Derbyshire
Public Path Diversion Order 2022

On the 21 June 2022 Peak District National Park Authority confirmed the above Order made under s119 Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the whole width of that part of Public Footpath no. 12 in the Parish of Parwich shown by a bold continuous line on the Order Map running from Point A on the Order Map (Grid Reference SK 1900 5696) in a generally southerly direction to Point B (Grid Reference SK 1897 5642) a total distance of approximately 570 metres or thereabouts

To

A 2 metre wide natural and stoned surfaced footpath in the parish of Parwich, shown by a bold broken line on the Order Map commencing at Point A at grid reference SK 1900 5696, running in a southerly direction to Point C at grid reference SK 1900 5673, then generally east south easterly to Point D at grid reference SK 1903 5657, then south westerly to Point E at grid reference SK 1900 5654, then southerly to Point F at grid reference SK 1900 5651, then east south easterly to Point G at grid reference SK 1902 5651 then south south westerly to Point H at grid reference SK 1900 5646 and finally south westerly to Point B at grid reference SK 1897 5642 a length of approximately 605 metres or thereabouts.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the Order Map have been placed at and may be seen free of charge at Aldern House, Baslow Road Bakewell Derbyshire DE45 1AE between 9.00am and 5.00pm. Copies of the Order and Order Map may be bought there at the price of £5.00.

Any person who wishes to claim compensation under section 28 as applied by s121(2) of the Highways Act 1980 for depreciation or damage for disturbance arising as a result of the coming into force of the order must make a claim in writing addressed to Head of Engagement at Aldern House, Baslow Road Bakewell Derbyshire DE45 1AE and serve it by delivering it at or sending it by prepaid post to that address not later than 18 August 2022. Copies of the sections are attached.

The order will come into force on the day on which the Authority certifies that there has been created to the reasonable satisfaction of the Authority an alternative highway for use as a replacement for the said footpath as provided above. But if a person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity or that of any provision contained in it on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980 as amended or on the ground that any requirement of the Act as amended or any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the order he or she may under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act within 6 weeks from 7 July 2022 make an application to the High Court.
