Byelaws for Car Parks

INTERPRETATION

1. In these byelaws:

"the Authority" means the Peak District National Park Authority;

"the land" means each of the areas of land owned or occupied by the Authority for the provision of parking places including any part of the said land which has been set apart by the Authority for uses ancillary to parking, and which are described in the Schedule to these Byelaws;

"vehicle" means a motor vehicle, motor cycle, invalid carriage, trailer or any other mechanically propelled vehicle;

"motor vehicle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle, not being an invalid carriage, intended or adapted for use on roads;

"motor cycle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle, not being an invalid carriage, with less than four wheels and the weight of which unladen does not exceed 410 kilograms:

"invalid carriage" means a vehicle, whether mechanically propelled or not, the unladen weight of which does not exceed 150 kilograms, the width of which does not exceed 0.85 metres and which has been constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of one person, being a person suffering from some physical disability and is used solely by such a person;

"trailer" means a vehicle designed to be drawn by a motor vehicle, and includes a caravan.

"cycle" means a bicycle, a tricycle, or a cycle having four or more wheels, not being in any case a motor cycle or motor vehicle.

"parking places" means those parts of the land where vehicles can be parked and which are not closed by a notice erected thereon by the Authority

VEHICLES

2. (1) No person shall, without reasonable excuse, drive or ride any vehicle on the land or bring or cause to be brought on to the land any vehicle except on those hard surfaced areas of the land which have been set apart by the Authority as parking places.
- (2) This Byelaw shall not prevent the driving or riding of those vehicles on the land for the purpose of parking in a space set apart for that purpose or on a route between it and the entrance to the land.
- (3) No person shall, without reasonable excuse, drive or ride any vehicle on the land except for the purpose of parking.
- (4) No person shall on the land abandon any cycle or vehicle.
- (5) Where by notice on site a parking place is described as not being available for vehicles over a specified weight and/or height and/or length, no person shall cause or permit a vehicle exceeding those specifications to be parked in that parking place.
- (6) If parking bays are marked out on the land the driver of a vehicle shall ensure that it is positioned wholly within a parking bay and shall not permit it to wait on the land unless it is so positioned.

- (7) If parking bays are not marked out on the land the driver of a vehicle shall ensure that it is positioned so that it does not obstruct other vehicles using the land, the free flow of traffic circulating within the land, any access to premises adjoining the site and the entrances to and exits from the land.
- (8) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be parked in a parking bay marked for disabled persons unless the vehicle displays a valid disabled person's badge in the relevant position and immediately before or immediately after the act of parking the vehicle has been or is about to be used by the person(s) in respect of whom the disabled person's badge has been issued.
- (9) No person shall continue to run the engine when the vehicle is in a parking place nor start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the land.
- (10) With the exception of sub-paragraphs (3) and (4) this Byelaw shall not extend to invalid carriages.

VEHICLE LICENCES

3. (1) The driver shall not permit a vehicle to wait on the land, unless it has a current vehicle licence for that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994.
- (2) This byelaw shall not apply to any vehicle exempted from duty by or under any enactment.

LIMIT ON WAITING

4. No person shall, without the consent of the Authority, leave any vehicle or cause or permit any vehicle to be left on the land between the hours of 12 midnight and 6 a.m.

PARKING TICKETS

5. (1) This Byelaw applies to those areas of the land that the Authority has set apart as a 'Pay and Display' car park.
- (2) The charges for a vehicle left in a Pay and Display car park shall during the hours specified by the Authority be:

Up to 1 hour	£1.50

Motorbikes

All day	£1.50
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Horse boxes/lorries

Up to 2 hours	£4.00

Coaches (where permitted)

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Parking permits

Annual permit	£40.00
Single horse box/trailer permit (annual)	£40.00
Holiday permit (weekly)	£15.00
Disabled Persons Badge holders	FREE
Cycles	FREE

- (3) The charges referred to in paragraph (2) (save in respect of parking permits) shall be payable by the insertion of an appropriate coin or coins into the apparatus or device provided or by means of a credit or debit card if the apparatus or device allows, or by an alternative approved method of payment where available.
- (4) A parking permit may be purchased from the Authority for a charge ascertained by reference to the charge specified in paragraph (2) of this Byelaw and that parking permit shall be valid in such Pay and Display car parks as specified thereon during the period for which it is issued. Damaged or lost parking permits may be replaced on application to the Authority and on payment of an administration fee. The damaged or lost parking permit will then become immediately invalid.
- (5) Any ticket issued on payment of the charges referred to in paragraph (2) of this Byelaw or parking permit issued in accordance with paragraph (4) of this Byelaw shall be attached in a conspicuous position to the vehicle in respect of which it was issued. A vehicle shall not be left in a Pay and Display car parking space without displaying a valid ticket or parking permit.
- (6) Sub-paragraph (5) of this Byelaw shall not extend to vehicles displaying in the relevant position a valid disabled persons badge provided that the vehicle immediately before or after the act of parking has been used or is about to be used by the person(s) in respect of whom the badge is issued.
- (7) A pay and display ticket is not transferable from one vehicle to another and on transfer the ticket ceases to be valid. A pay and display ticket is only valid in the parking place in which it was issued. This is defined by the reference code of the ticket machine located in that parking place printed on the pay and display ticket.

AMOUNT OF EXCESS CHARGE AT PARKING PLACES

6. (1) If a vehicle is left in a Pay and Display car parking place and

- (i) the appropriate charge (if any) in accordance with the scale of charges specified in Byelaw 5(2) has not been paid, or
- (ii) any ticket or parking permit purchased has not been duly exhibited on the vehicle in the manner specified in Byelaw 5(5), or
- (iii) another contravention of these Byelaws has occurred,

a charge in accordance with the following schedule (such charge is referred to hereafter as the "excess charge") shall be payable:

Contravention	Charge
Parked without payment of the parking charge.	£50
Using a vehicle in a parking place in connection with the sale or offering or exposing for sale of goods when prohibited.	£70
Parked in a restricted area in a car park.	£70
Parked after the expiry of paid for time.	£50
Parked in a pay & display car park without clearly displaying a valid pay & display ticket or parking permit.	£50
Parked beyond the bay markings.	£50
Parked in a disabled person's parking space without clearly displaying a valid disabled person's badge.	£70
Vehicle parked exceeds maximum weight and/or height and/or length permitted in the area.	£70
Parked in an area not designated for that class of vehicle.	£70
Parked causing an obstruction.	£70
Parked in car park when closed.	£50
Parked with engine running where prohibited.	£50

- (2) The excess charge shall be reduced by 50% if payment is received by the Authority within 14 days of notification.
- (3) In the case of a vehicle in respect of which an excess charge may have been incurred, it shall be the duty of a parking attendant to attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position a notice which shall include the following particulars:
 - (a) the registration mark of the vehicle or, where the vehicle is being used under a trade licence, the number of the trade plate carried by the vehicle;
 - (b) the time at which he first observed that a contravention of the Byelaws had occurred;
 - (c) a statement that an excess charge is required to be paid and its amount;
 - (d) the manner in which, and the time within which, the excess charge should be paid and
 - (e) a statement of the contravention of the Byelaws observed.
- (4) The particulars given in any notice served on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of these Byelaws shall be treated as evidence in any proceedings relating to failure to pay the excess charge.
- (5) The expiry of the period for which the appropriate charge has been paid shall be
 - (a) where a pay and display ticket has been purchased, when the time shown on the clock of the issuing ticket machine is later than the expiry time shown on the pay and display ticket displayed, or
 - (b) where an alternative approved method of payment has been used, when the period for which payment has been made and recorded has been exceeded.
- (6) If at any time while a vehicle is parked in a parking place no pay and display ticket or parking permit is displayed on that vehicle in the relevant position and in accordance with the provisions of these Byelaws, it shall be deemed that the charge has not been paid.
- (7) If at the time when a vehicle is parked during the charging hours in a parking place and the nearest ticket machine in that parking place is out of order, then a ticket shall be obtained from another ticket machine within the same parking place (where provided) or as directed in the parking place.
- (8) Where no valid pay and display ticket can be obtained from a ticket machine within a parking place, vehicles may be parked in a parking place without the purchase and display of a ticket, but may not be parked for longer than the maximum period of parking in that parking place as advertised at the parking place.
- (9) Where payment has been made through an alternative approved method of payment and no pay and display ticket is produced following the process, the driver of a vehicle shall be exempt from the requirement to display such a ticket.

RESTRICTION ON REMOVAL OF NOTICES

7. When a notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with any of the foregoing provisions of these Byelaws no person other than a person authorised by the Authority in that behalf or the driver or a person authorised by the driver in that behalf shall remove the notice from the vehicle.

LIABILITY OF VEHICLE OWNERS

8. (1) For the purposes of the institution of proceedings in respect of the offence of failure to comply with Byelaws 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 it shall be presumed (notwithstanding that that person may not be an individual) that the registered keeper of the vehicle was the driver of the vehicle at the relevant time and, accordingly, that acts or omissions of the driver of the vehicle at that time were the acts or omissions of the registered keeper.

- (2) Notwithstanding the presumption in (1) above, it is open to the defence in any proceedings to prove that the person who was the registered keeper of the vehicle at a particular time was not the driver of the vehicle at the relevant time.

CAMPING

9. No person shall on the land, without the consent of the Authority, erect or use a tent or use any vehicle, including a caravan, or any other structure for the purpose of camping.

FIRES

10. (1) No person shall on the land intentionally, recklessly or carelessly light, stoke or tend a fire, or place, throw or let fall a lighted match or any other thing so as to be likely to cause a fire.
- (2) This Byelaw shall not prevent the lighting or use of a properly constructed camping stove or any other cooking appliance in any area set aside for the purpose, in such a manner as not to cause danger of or damage by fire.

PROTECTION OF VEGETATION

11. No person shall on the land remove or displace any soil, rock, turf, plant, shrub or tree on the land or pluck any bud, blossom or flower of any plant, shrub or tree.

DAMAGE

12. (1) No person shall on the land intentionally, recklessly or carelessly destroy or damage any building, wall, fence, hedge, gatepost or any other structure which has been erected on the land.
- (2) No person shall on the land intentionally, recklessly or carelessly destroy or damage any surface provided for the parking of vehicles.
- (3) No person shall with intent to defraud interfere with a ticket machine or operate or attempt to operate it by the insertion of objects other than undamaged and unaltered coins of legal tender and of the appropriate denomination.

ADVERTISEMENTS AND WRITING OR MARKING ETC

13. No person shall on the land without the consent of the Authority affix or cause to be affixed any advertisement bill placard or notice upon any building wall fence gatepost tree rock or stone in or abutting on the land nor deface by cutting or otherwise writing or marking words or marks thereon any building wall fence gatepost tree rock or stone on the land.

PUBLIC MEETINGS AND ORGANIZED EVENTS

14. No person shall on the land without the consent of the Authority hold any public meeting or deliver any public speech or hold any organised event or activity.

TRADING

15. No person shall on the land, without the consent of the Authority, sell, or offer or expose for sale, or let to hire, or offer or expose for letting to hire, any commodity or article.

BEHAVIOUR

16. (1) No person on the land shall, after being requested to desist by an officer of the Authority or by any person disturbed or by any person acting on his behalf, cause or permit to be made any noise which is so loud or so continuous or repeated so as to cause a disturbance to other persons:

- (a) by shouting or singing;
- (b) by playing a musical instrument; or
- (c) by operating or permitting to be operated any radio, gramophone, amplifier, tape recorder, compact disc player or similar instrument

unless that person is holding or taking part in any entertainment held with the consent of the Authority.

- (2) No person on the land shall willfully sound any horn or any other similar instrument on a vehicle without reasonable cause.
- (3) No person on the land shall use any threatening, abusive or insulting language, gesture or conduct with intent to put any person in fear or so as to occasion a breach of the peace or whereby a breach of the peace is likely to be occasioned.

OBSTRUCTION

17. No person shall on the land:

- (a) intentionally obstruct any officer of the Authority in the proper execution of his duties;
- (b) intentionally obstruct any person carrying out an act which is necessary to the proper execution of any contract with the Authority; or
- (c) intentionally obstruct any other person in the proper use of the land, or behave so as to give reasonable grounds for annoyance to other persons on the land.

RELOCATION, REMOVAL AND DISPOSAL OF VEHICLES

- 18. (1)** A person authorized by the Authority or a police officer in uniform may, using such measures as are appropriate, move or cause to be moved in the case of an emergency to any place he/she thinks fit, any vehicle parked in a parking place.
- (2) Any person removing a vehicle from a parking place under the provisions of these Byelaws shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary to provide for the safe keeping of the vehicle.

LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

- 19.** The Authority accepts no liability for the loss or damage to vehicles or other property left on the land save for that arising from the negligence of the Authority.

VALIDITY

- 20.** If a court or any other competent authority declares any part of these Byelaws to be invalid or unenforceable, such declaration shall not invalidate the remainder of these Byelaws.

SAVINGS

- 21. (1)** An act necessary to the proper execution of his duty on the land by an officer of the Authority, or any act which is necessary to the proper execution of any contract with the Authority, shall not be an offence under these Byelaws.
- (2) Nothing in or done under any of the provisions of these Byelaws shall in any respect prejudice or injuriously affect any public right of way through the land or the rights of any person acting legally by virtue of some estate, right or interest in, over or affecting the land or any part thereof.

PENALTY

22. Any person offending against any of these Byelaws shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the standard scale.

REVOCATION

23. The byelaws made by the Authority on 14 November 2013 and confirmed by the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs on 21 November 2013 relating to the land are hereby revoked.

THESE BYELAWS are made under section 90 sub-section (1) and (5) of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949 by the Peak District National Park Authority with respect to areas of land owned or occupied as parking places.



Alstonefield	On the west side of the road to Hulme End near the centre of Alstonefield village. Grid Reference SK 131556.
Ashbourne (Blore Pastures)	On the eastern side of the minor road between Blore and Ilam. Grid Reference SK 135499.
Ashbourne (Mapleton Lane)	On the minor road from Ashbourne to Mapleton 2km north of Ashbourne town centre. Grid Reference SK 175469.
Barber Booth	On the minor road to Upper Booth 2.5km west of Edale. Grid Reference SK 107847.
Burbage Bridge	On the minor (Sheffield to Hathersage) road 4km west of Ringinglow. Grid Reference SK 260830.
Cressbrook (Ravensdale)	On the east side of a minor road leading to Ravensdale (from the village of Cressbrook. Grid Reference SK 172737.
Crowden	On the north side of A628 (Hyde to Penistone) road 8km east of Tintwistle. Grid Reference SK 073993.
Goyt Valley (Derbyshire Bridge)	On a minor road leading to Errwood Reservoir from the A537 (Buxton to Macclesfield) road. Grid Reference SK 018716.
Goyt Valley (The Street)	Overlooking Errwood Reservoir in the Goyt Valley 10km north west of Buxton. Grid Reference SK 013756.
Hathersage (Surprise View)	On the north side of the A625 (Sheffield to Hathersage) road 4km east of Hathersage. Grid Reference SK 252802.
Hayfield (Bowden Bridge)	On the western side of the Kinder Road 2.5km east of Hayfield. Grid Reference SK 048868.
High Peak Trail (Friden)	On the east side of the A524 (Bakewell to Newhaven) road and opposite the Friden Silica Brick Works. Grid Reference SK 173607.
High Peak Trail (Hurdlow)	On the minor road to Longnor at Sparklow 1km west of A515 (Ashbourne to Buxton) road. Grid Reference SK 127658.
High Peak Trail (Minninglow)	On a minor road off A5012 (Newhaven to Cromford) road 1.5km south of Pikehall hamlet. Grid Reference SK 194583.
High Peak Trail (Parsley Hay)	Situated on the western side of the A515 (Ashbourne to Buxton) road. Grid Reference SK 147637.
Ilam Coach Lay-by	Adjacent to a minor road between Ilam and Thorpe to the south of Dovedale. Grid Reference SK 1444 5056
Macclesfield (Lamaload)	Situated on a minor road at Lamaload Reservoir 6km north of A537 (Buxton to Macclesfield) road. Grid Reference SK 975753.
Macclesfield (Trentabank)	Situated near Trentabank Reservoir and approx 4km from Langley village. Grid Reference SJ 962712.
Manifold Trail (Hulme End)	On the south side of the B5054 at the entrance to the Manifold Trail in the hamlet of Hulme End. Grid Reference SK 103593.
Milldale	On the minor road from Milldale to Hopedale 0.75km west of Milldale. Grid Reference SK 138547.

Monsal Trail (Bakewell Station)	Off Station Road 1km north of Bakewell town centre. Grid Reference SK 223690.
Monsal Trail (Millers Dale)	Situated off the minor road 200m north from the B6049 at Millers Dale. Grid Reference SK 138733.
Stanage (Dennis Knoll)	Below the central part of Stanage Edge on the minor road from Sheffield to Bamford. Grid Reference SK 227840.
Stanage (Hollin Bank)	Below the eastern part of Stanage Edge on the minor road from Sheffield to Bamford. Grid Reference SK 237838.
Stanage (Hooks Car)	At the eastern end of Stanage Edge on the minor road from Sheffield to Bamford. Grid Reference SK 244829.
Thorpe (Narlows Lane)	On a minor road 2.5km west of A515 (Ashbourne to Buxton) road near the Dog and Partridge Inn. Grid Reference SK 164505.
Tideswell Dale	On the east side of B6049 (Tideswell to Millers Dale) road 2.5km south of Tideswell. Grid Reference SK 154743.
Tissington Trail (Alsop-en-le-Dale)	On east side of A515 (Ashbourne to Buxton) road 2.5km from Alsop-en-le Dale. Grid Reference SK 155549.
Tissington Trail (Hartington)	On south side of the B5054 and 3km east Hartington. Grid Reference SK 149611.
Tissington Trail (Thorpe)	Situated off a minor road 2.5km west of the A515 (Ashbourne to Buxton) road. Grid Reference SK 166503.
Tissington Trail (Tissington)	Situated on the eastern outskirts of Tissington village. Grid Reference SK 177521.
Torside	On south side of B6105 (Glossop to Crowden) road overlooking Torside Reservoir. Grid Reference SK 067983.
Upperdale	On the minor road from Monsal Head to Litton 1.5km south of Cressbrook. Grid Reference SK 176722.
Waterhouses	Situated on the old station site at Waterhouses on the A52 (Ashbourne to Leek) road. Grid Reference SK 085502.
Wilboarclough (Brookside)	Adjacent to Clough Road to the south of Wilboarclough 1.8km north of the A54 (Buxton to Congleton) road. Grid Reference SJ 980681
Wildboarclough (Clough House)	On the east side of the minor road 1km north east of Wildboarclough. Grid Reference SJ 987699.
Wildboarclough (Nab Quarry)	On a minor road 1.5km north of A54 (Buxton to Congleton) road and 1.5km south west of Wildboarclough. Grid Reference SJ 973680.
Wildboarclough (Vicarage Quarry)	On the west side of the road 2.5km north east of Wildboarclough. Grid Reference SJ 984705.
White Lodge	On the south side of the A6 (Bakewell to Buxton) road 3.5km west of Ashford-in-the water. Grid Reference SK 104725.
Wyedale	Situated 6km east of Buxton on the A6 (Buxton to Bakewell) road. Grid Reference SK 104725.
Youlgreave (Moor Lane)	On a minor road off the A524 (Bakewell to Newhaven) road and 1.75km west of Youlgreave. Grid Reference SK 194645.
